



ABOUT US

HKU SPACE

HKU SPACE is the Extension Arm of the University of Hong Kong. Its mission is to provide learning opportunities for personal, professional and career development. Since its establishment in 1956, over one and a half million people have enrolled on HKU SPACE courses.

THE UNIVERSITY OF LONDON

The University of London(UoL), one of the oldest and largest universities in the U.K., was established in 1836 by Royal Charter. The University is a federation of 17 independent member institutions and 3 central academic bodies. The University is in collaboration with 11 of the member institutions for the worldwide programmes, with a student population of more than 120,000. Its Worldwide Programmes allow students to undertake their studies outside London. The University stresses that the standard of the degree awarded to ALL of its students, wherever they are studying, is the same.



Each degree consists of 12 courses. These courses may be taken in any order provided that certain prerequisite courses have been passed.

- A University of London BSc graduate can be regarded as having studied the `University of London BSc programme at HKU SPACE' if the following conditions are satisfied.
- 1. The courses taken, or given 'Recognition and Accreditation of Prior Learning' in the programme, satisfy the programme content and structure stated in this brochure, and
- 2. The student enrolled in the HKU SPACE tuition courses for all the courses in the programme, except the courses which are granted 'Recognition and Accreditation of Prior Learning'.

Rules of Progression for BSc programmes

- For students who initially registered in or after 2011.
- You can take up to four full new courses in a year.
- In your final year of study, you may take five new courses in your final year, provided you are not carrying a failed course.
- You may take a maximum of five courses at any examination period, in either a combination of new courses and resits (with a maximum of four new full courses) or resits only, in an academic year.
- In your first year of study through the Standard Route, you may only take 100 courses, unless you have granted RPL for at least two full 100 courses or equivalent.

Assessment

- Each full course will be examined by one three-hour/three-hour fifteen-minute examination paper.
- Each half course will be examined by one two-hour examination paper.
- The University of London examinations are held once a year in May/June. A resit assessment session for selected courses takes place in October/November each year.
- Examination registration will be held in December by Hong Kong Examination and Assessment Authority.

Tuition Courses at HKU SPACE

- Each HKU SPACE tuition course comprises a total of 54 teaching hours.
- Classes will normally be held on weekday evenings and weekends which may include Sundays & public holidays.
- Classes will be held in Admiralty or other HKUSPACE learning centres, subject to availability.
- The tentative start day of tuition courses is early / mid September, 2022.

Revision Courses

- Revision courses may also be organised in Hong Kong. They are taught by teaching staff from the University of London, other U.K. or overseas universities in March/April every year.
- Course fee for each revision course: HK\$2,200 per course, which included one mock examination and three / four consecutive lessons. The fee is reviewed annually and subject to change.

STANDARD ROUTE

Applicants shall have:

- 1. 2 HKDSE Category A subjects at Level 3 (including English Language) and 3 HKDSE Category A subjects at Level 2 (including Mathematics); or
- 2. (a) 2 GCE 'A' Level Grade E + 3 GCE 'O' Level Grade C (including English Language & Mathematics); or (b) 2 HKAL Grade E + HKCEE English Language at Grade C & 2 subjects at Grade E in HKCEE (including Mathematics); or
- 3. International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma including Mathematics / Mathematical Studies at Grade 3 (Higher Level / Standard Level); or
- 4. An Associate Degree / a Higher Diploma from HKU SPACE or other recognised awarding institutions*.

Students transfer to the BSc programmes from the University of London International Foundation Programme.

Students of the University of London International Foundation Programme (IFP) may progress to the BSc programmes by applying to transfer their registration, provided that they have passed all four full courses in the University of London International Foundation Programme.

GRADUATE ENTRY ROUTE

For graduate entry, in addition to the qualifications listed above, applicants must hold a full first degree completed in a minimum of three years duration on a full time basis (or equivalent) from a university or other institution acceptable to the University of London.

- (1) Classes are normally held on weekday evenings and weekends (daytime and evenings), and may also be held on public holidays and Sundays. The courses are arranged according to the HKSAR non-office hours times.
- (2) Typhoon and Black Rainstorm

For classes & examinations that have not yet started:

For classes & examinations that have already started:

When Typhoon Signal No 8 or above is hoisted, all classes should be immediately suspended but all examinations will continue until the end of that examination session unless the examination venue is found to be of potential risk to candidates. When the Black Rainstorm Signal is in force, all classes and examinations will continue but all outdoor activities will be suspended.

- (3) Unless a course is over-subscribed or cancelled, the course fees and repeating course fees are non-refundable. If the applicant is unsuccessful in the application, the applicant should note the refund conditions outlined in the course application form.
