Bachelor of Arts (Honours) Social Sciences

This is a part-time degree programme offered locally by Edinburgh Napier University (ENU) in collaboration with HKU SPACE. The aim of this programme is to educate and inspire students to meet the needs of the Hong Kong Society, in particular careers with the government agencies and the social service sector, by producing graduates capable of managing the highly complex requirements of these roles. The programme combines the study of different social science disciplines such as psychology, sociology, criminology, geography and politics. Students will develop a detailed understanding of, and the research skills to investigate, the social world, relationships within it and the social forces that impact on us all. All teaching is delivered in English.

Duration of Study and Award

An exit award of BA Social Sciences ordinary degree is available for students who have only completed the first half of the programme (120 credits). Students who have successfully completed the entire programme (240 credits) will be awarded a Bachelor of Arts (Honours) Social Sciences degree by Edinburgh Napier University.

This programme is delivered on a part-time basis. Normally, classes will be held on weekday evenings and/or Saturdays. With full exemptions, students can complete the programme in a minimum of 2 years (6 trimesters, 40 credits per trimester). The final year of study will be offered subject to sufficient number of continuing students.

Programme Structure

The entire Bachelor of Arts (Honours) Social Sciences programme at the home country consists of 480 credits under the Scottish Higher Education system. Applicants who possess the entry qualifications and are approved by Edinburgh Napier University would be exempted a total of 240 credits, and will be required to complete only 240 credits for graduation.

Entry Requirements:



Applicants shall:

 hold an Associate Degree/a Higher Diploma / an Advanced Diploma in Social Sciences / Applied Social Sciences such as General Social Sciences, Sociology, Psychology, Criminal Justice, Youth or Social Services, etc. with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0;

and

2) demonstrate English proficiency by having a minimum overall score of 6.0 on the IELTS or 550 on the TOEFL.

Graduates of HKU SPACE Associate Degree / Higher Diploma / Advanced Diploma, or graduates from a recognised institution where the normal medium of instruction is English, are normally regarded as having demonstrated the required English proficiency if they have obtained grade "C" or higher in the English course(s) of their respective Associate Degree / Higher Diploma / Advanced Diploma programmes.

Applicants need to have successfully studied prerequisite modules in their former studies (introduction to psychology, introduction to sociology and research methods, or equivalent).

Tuition Fee

HKD20,200 per installment (Total 6 installments in 2 years)

Applicants should submit:

- 1. Duly completed HKU SPACE application form (SF26)[#];
- 2. Copies of academic certificates;
- 3. A copy of HKID card or passport; and
- 4. An application fee of HK\$150 by crossed cheque (payable to "HKU SPACE")
